The minimum requirements for admission for **undergraduates** are:

- completion of 12 credit hours of economics courses; and
- attainment of a Grade Point Average of 3.0 or better in economics courses and an overall GPA of at least 3.0

Graduate students in economics are judged solely on their graduate work and must have:

- completed one semester of full-time work, with a major or minor in economics; and
- attainment of a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Complete and print an application form and turn it in to the Economics Department office (Wooten 325) on or before **Wednesday, March 6th**. You will receive an invitation to join ODE once your eligibility has been verified. The application form is here

If all requirements are met, you will be asked to turn in your membership fee (check payable to ODE) no later than **Wednesday, March 20th**. Checks will be mailed to ODE with the application form by the faculty sponsor.
