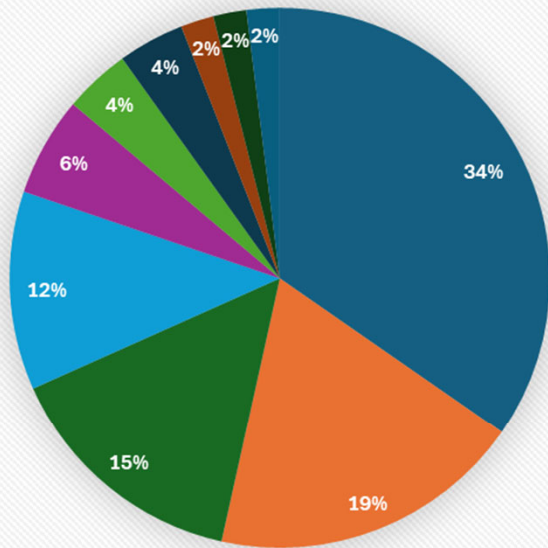

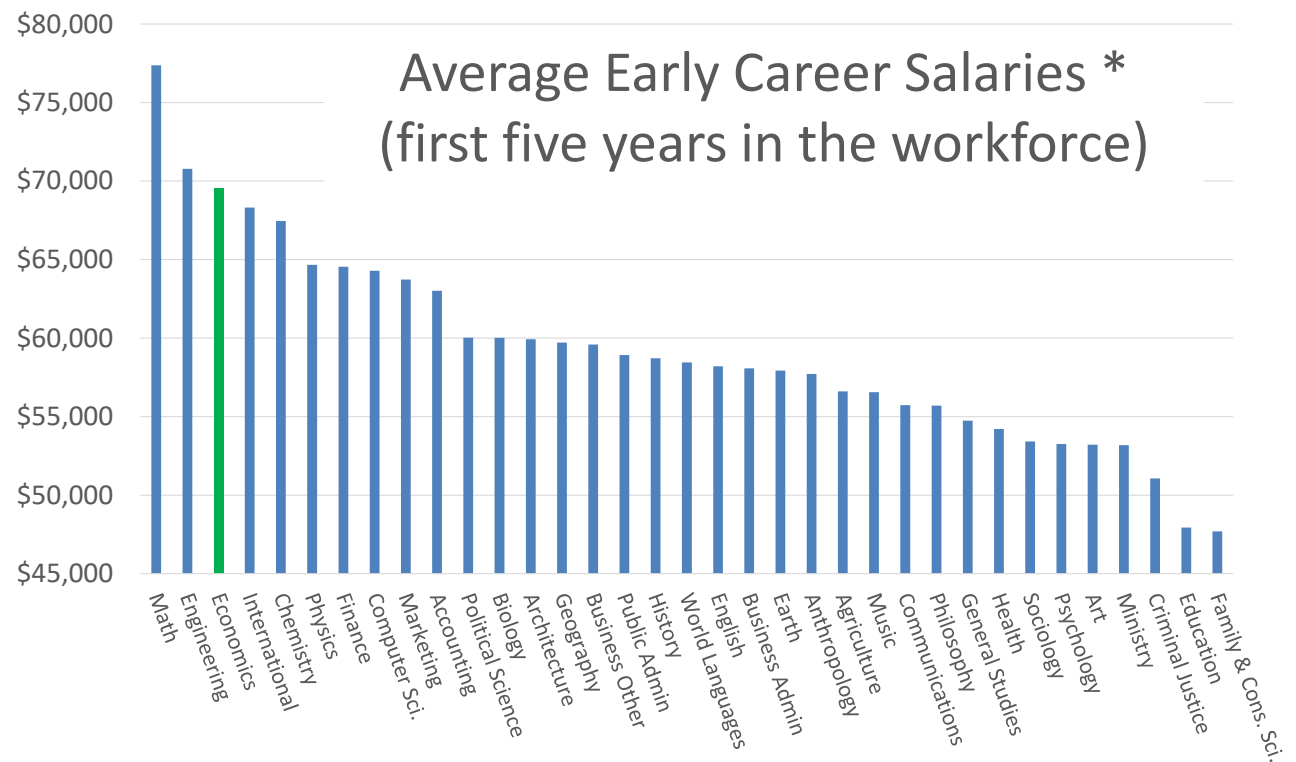

Yes, they are! Here are average early career salaries of the top 35 majors. Only mathematics and engineering majors earn more than economics majors.

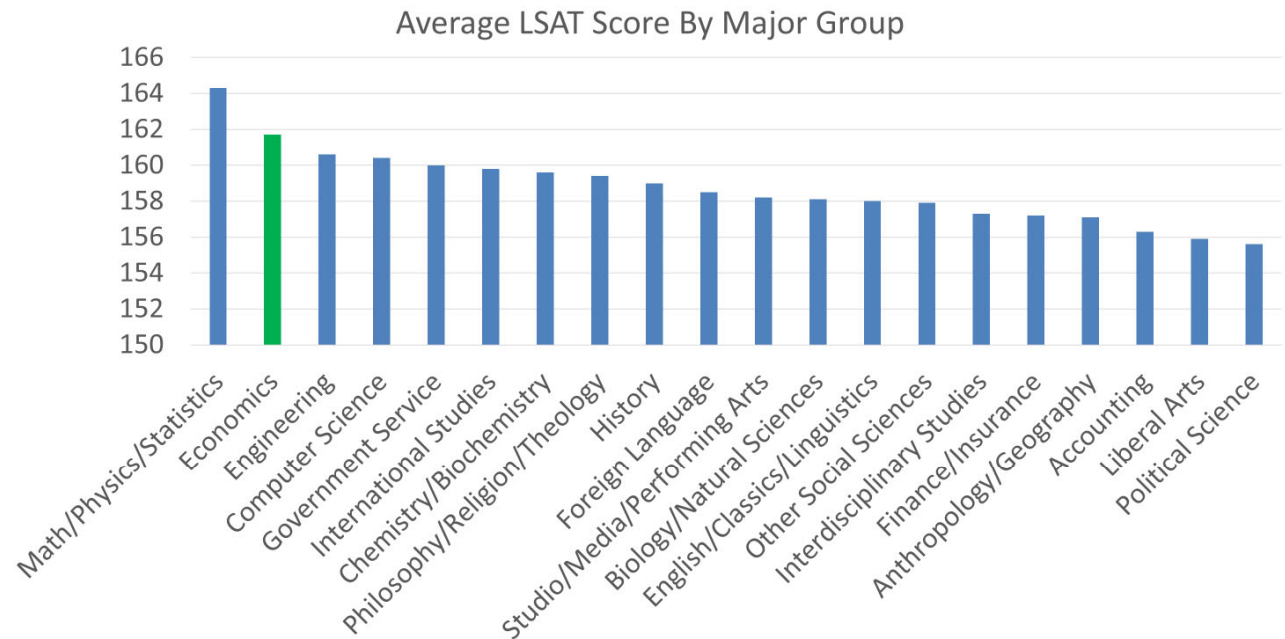
